

WELCOME TO THE LIONFISH DERBY

You're invited to partner in the second annual Sarasota Lionfish Derby. This exciting and environmentally beneficial event will be hosted by Mote Marine Laboratory, a world-class marine science institution, in cooperation with Reef Environmental Education Foundation (REEF), which helps study and address the lionfish invasion and sanctions official Lionfish Derbies, and ZooKeeper, the Sarasota-based manufacturer of the leading lionfish containment unit used throughout invaded areas.

Lionfish Derbies are an important way to harvest large numbers of this invasive species that has spread along the eastern Atlantic coast, through the Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico. Derbies help to facilitate lionfish removal, provide research opportunity, public education, and the opportunity to taste lionfish for free.

This year's event will be based at Mote, with a captains' meeting on July 10, lionfish hunting July 11 on beautiful Gulf of Mexico and the lionfish weigh-in July 12 at the Sarasota Outboard Club next door to Mote. The venues, on Sarasota's City Island, provide easy access to Gulf waters and a gorgeous coastal location just a short distance away from the charming shopping and restaurant destinations of St. Armand's Circle.

This event provides several opportunities to meet and talk with competitors and with Mote and REEF representatives dedicated to the conservation, sustainable use and stewardship of marine ecosystems. The captains' meeting and awards ceremony will allow sponsors at certain levels to interact with competitors and answer questions about their products.

ABOUT LIONFISH

Lionfish of the two species *Pterois volitans* and *Pterois miles* were introduced to the Atlantic via the U.S. aquarium trade beginning in the 1980s — and since then, they've invaded our waters with significant impact. Continuing to understand their distribution, abundance and impact on native communities of fishes and invertebrates along with eradication efforts remain top priorities.

Here are some lionfish facts, including reasons why their invasion is a major concern:

- The lionfish-invaded range is North Carolina to South America, including the Gulf of Mexico.
- In less than five years, lionfish have become established throughout the Caribbean.
- Lionfish may live for decades and reach sizes exceeding 19 inches.
- They inhabit all marine habitat types and depths down to 1,000 feet.
- Their venomous spines deter predators and cause mild to serious reactions in humans.
- Their temperature tolerance is approximately 50-95 degrees Fahrenheit.
- They sexually mature in less than a year.
- Reproduction occurs throughout the year.
- Lionfish eggs are held together in a gelatinous mass of 12,000 to 15,000 eggs and are dispersed at the ocean's surface by currents.
- Their larval duration is approximately 25 days.
- Lionfish can reach densities of more than 200 adults per acre.
- Lionfish are generalist carnivores that consume more than 70 species of fish and many invertebrate species. They can eat prey up to half their body length.
- They can prey upon commercially, recreationally, and ecologically important species.
- Dense lionfish populations can consume more than 460,000 prey fish per acre per year.
- On heavily invaded sites, lionfish have reduced their fish prey populations by up to 90 percent and continue to consume native fishes at unsustainable rates.
- Native predators exhibit avoidance for lionfish.
- Lionfish are susceptible to very few parasites compared to native species.
- Lionfish exhibit site fidelity.
- Lionfish have a high affinity for structure and feed primarily during dawn and dusk.
- Lionfish are edible and considered a delicacy.
- Local removal efforts (Lionfish Derbies) that are sustained can significantly reduce lionfish densities.
